

HARRINGTON SCHOOL

In 1850, S.S. No. 17 West Zorra obtained from David Demorset the deed for the quarter acre of land on which our Harrington School now stands. The price of the land was one shilling. On the south-west corner of the land they built the first log school at what was then Springfield. Since then the school section has been renumbered 4 instead of 17 and the growing village has been re-named Harrington.

Many pupils, who had previously gone to Bennington and Brooksdale schools, started to the new log school in Harrington in the early fifties. The log school lasted for nearly 20 years. There was an attendance of well over 100 boys and girls, many of them in their late teens and early twenties. The seats and desks were homemade. The entrance was at the north side of the school. A box stove kept the school cosy and warm in the cold winter weather. The teacher's desk was a long low varnished one, made of wood and the teacher sat on a bench. Surrounding the school property was a rail fence.

The old school lacked sufficient seating capacity sufficient light and other requirements, so in 1869, the trustees gave Mr. Grant of St. Marys the contract of building the attractive stone part of our present school.

The new stone school was considered to be a wonderful improvement on theold log building. It was a joyous group of 112 boys and girls who in 1896 were ushered into the new school by their teacher Norman Meldrum. The School board bought new double seats for the new school. There was a better lighting and heating system. The windows were made so they would open from bottom or top to ensure better ventilation. On the windows they put rolling shades to guard against cross lighting and to prevent the direct sunlight from falling on the desks. The woodwork was painted and the hardwood floors seemed quite a luxury. There was such a large attendance that the seats would not hold the pupils and for a time a second teacher was engaged to teach pupils in the cloak room. When the stone room was first built there was no basement under it. It was heated with a large box stove placed half way through the partition between the class room and the cloak room. In the year 1902, the basement was dug out and a new furnace was installed.

On August 1, 1878, Mr. F. Young was given the contract of building a brick addition to the school for the summof \$725. From 1878 to 1913 both rooms of our school were used. From 1913 to 1923 they used only the stone room.





Water was piped from across the road into the school in early 1920's.

In 1924, when the brick room was opened again, it was used for the senior pupils and the junior pupils were taught in the stone room. In 1924 the brick room was fitted out with new seats, slate blackboards, new window blinds and the interior was redecorated. In the brick room the school board also built a large cupboard to hold equipment for the High School work. The Ante Room was built onto the brick room in 1930-31.

In 1932 Hydro was installed in the school. For many years Harrington has been famous for its wonderful school concerts. These proved a source of much pleasure for the teacher and pupils and at the same time they made enough money to buy several things for the school. With the money they bought an organ, a piano, a bookcase, many books, a new school fence and numerous other things for the school.

Years ago our school took an active part in school fair work taking many prizes for singing, parading, public speaking, school exhibits and individual exhibits.

Many of our Harrington pupils and teachers have made a great name for themselves. John Matheson, Norman Meldrum, Wm. Murray, Wm. Kalbfleish and Andrew Gordon all taught in Harrington School and later became Doctors. Elizabeth McMaster taught here and she became a famous missionary and Doctor in India. Gordon Campbell taught here and later became a lawyer in Listowell. Jim Hill was a Harrington pupil, later a Harrington teacher, then a mining engineer and then an instructor in a mining school. H. Gordon Manning taught here and was an instructor in the Stratford Normal School.

Numerous Harrington pupils made a mark in the world for themselves. Gilbert Gordon, Henry Gordon, Jack McKenzie and Gordon Morris became Doctors. Chas. Gordon, better known as Ralph Conner, was a Harrington pupil who made a great name for himself as a writer, a doctor and a minister. Percy Hill was a Dentist. Wm. Ross was a famous musician, also a writer.

In 1937, manual training equipment was installed in the school and new seats and desks were put in the stone room. The same year music was first taught in the school with Marguerite Murray of Maplewood being the teacher. In 1941, the school purchased from James Clark 1 7/8 acres of land behind the school for the sum of \$106.

In 1943, our senior or brick room was closed. All grades were taught in the stone room, except 1st and 2nd form were discontinued.

Our local school board ceased to exist, and entered into the township area of West Zorra with five trustees for the area in January 1945, The West Zorra school area board in Sept, 1946 introduced manual training and agriculture which was taught in the school by Mr. Jacques who came half a day each week





The school was completely renovated in July and August of 1949. Flush toilets and sinks were installed in the brick room. A new concrete floor was laid in the basement to accomodate a new stoker furnace. New steps and pipe railing were erected at the entrance to the stone room. A new hardwood floor was laid and desks placed upon skids. Below the blackboards, cupboards were installed.

In September, 1957, the brick room was opened and re-decorated to accommodate the large enrolment.

In 1964 the brick room was closed and grades 1 to 6 were taught in the stone room while 7 and 8 are being bussed to Zorra Highland Park School.

A former pupil James McKay was ordained this year as a minister of the United Church in Vancouver.

Harrington school boys played a very noble part overseas at the time of World War one. Four of our pupils-Alex Reid, Bill Hill, Ed Hill and Edwin McKay paid the supreme sacrifice. Jack Clark, Hugh Reid, Wm. Clark, Ernest Bossence, Robert Sutherland, Sidney McKay, George Walsh, Gordon Morris and Harry Keeny all saw active service in the World War.


